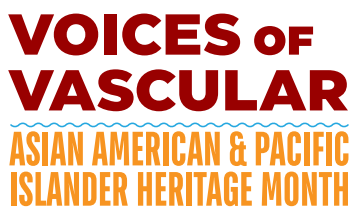
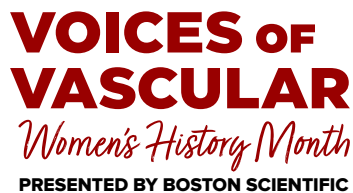

## Voices of Vascular

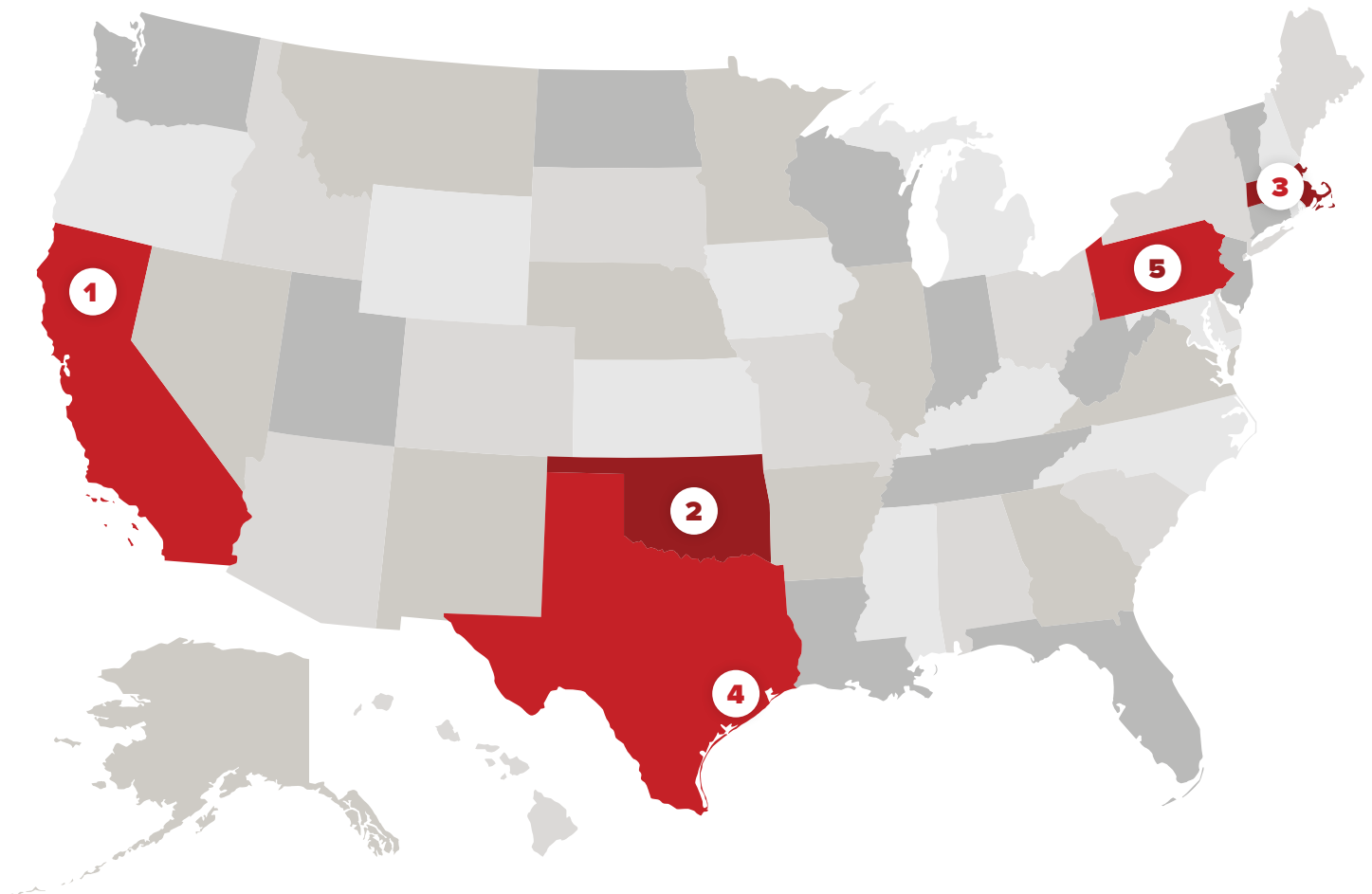

The SVS Foundation's Vascular Care for the Underserved™ Pilot Project grants support initiatives explicitly designed to explore solutions to the significant disparities in vascular surgical care delivery across the United States.
