

### CPVI Scholarship Information and Terms & Conditions

The Society for Vascular Surgery (SVS) and Association of Program Directors in Vascular Surgery (APDVS) have worked together with Complex Vascular Peripheral Intervention Skills Course (CPVI) industry supporters – Cook Medical and Penumbra – to create scholarships for trainees attending the course! After the course, scholarship recipients will each receive a mailed check for \$1,000 to help with expenses associated with the course (i.e. registration, travel expenses).

The limited number of scholarships will be given on a first-come, first-served basis to SVS member resident/fellows who register for the course at [vascular.org/cpvi25](https://vascular.org/cpvi25).

Scholarship recipients will need to agree to the following terms and conditions to accept the scholarship and receive the monetary award via mailed check after the course.

- Be a current SVS member resident/fellow and paid, registered CPVI 25 attendee
- Attend both days of the course taking place September 20-21 in Rosemont, IL
- Attend the trainee lunch on September 21 hosted by the scholarship co-sponsors Cook and Penumbra
- Complete the post-CPVI25 evaluation
- Complete a follow-up survey in the future from SVS to assess outcomes of the CPVI course

If a scholarship is available at the time of registration, the resident/fellow will receive an email from [education@vascularsurgery.org](mailto:education@vascularsurgery.org) within 24 business hours of registering informing them they were awarded a scholarship. They will be asked to confirm their acceptance and agree to the terms and conditions.
